President's Announcements and New Business:

Note on misprinting of budget – apparent formatting issue.

Important Announcement: Paddi is parliamentarian and nominator. Turning in a slate of candidates to the board for president, treasurer, parliamentarian, and historian next week. Members will be informed of candidates in September, voting is on October.

Program:

How to Prepare your Quilt for Fair Entry by Sharon Berna (quilt superintendent) and Jana Berna (VQG treasurer). Why enter? Share! Inspire! Contribute! And Celebrate! The quilts that move people aren't even usually the ones with ribbons. Entries are this Friday and Saturday, 11-7.

1. Is my quilt Clean? FYI – you can use your own spit to get your own blood off your quilt. Keep scents in mind.
2. Details: Design, Piecing, finishing. Check the exhibit guide.
3. Questions:
 - a. Solo vs group: if any other person worked on it in any way, its group.
 - b. Professional category removed, beginner category added.
 - c. If you use a pattern, but adapt it, how do you describe that? Doesn't really matter except for original design. Start with construction technique then size to decide category.
 - d. Where do you find your entry number if you've lost it? They have it IN THE BOOK.
 - e. OK if two different divisions and same class? Yes. Its ok.
 - f. All judges are local.

- g. If this is my second time entering, can someone help me figure out what category? Yes.
- h. Filling out the form ahead of time expedites the process.
- i. We hear we're one of the best shows out there, only beat out by Paducah!

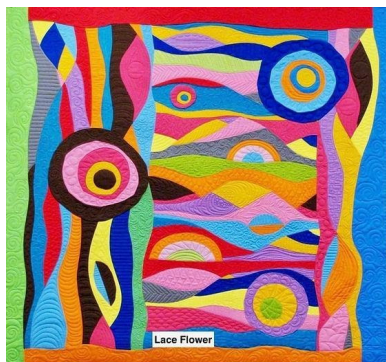
EDUCATION NEWS

September BOM – “Loop the Loop” – 12 ½” unfinished

Colors: Gold, cream, and brown – Directions and video link on website.

1 Entry = 1 Block. Can enter up to two BOMs.

October BOM – “Big Dipper” – Unfinished size 10 ½”

Colors Dk Blue, Lt Blue, Gold. Trim each smaller squares to 5 ½”. Directions and videos on website. 1 Entry = One 10 ½” Block made up of the 4 squares. Can enter up to two BOMs.
