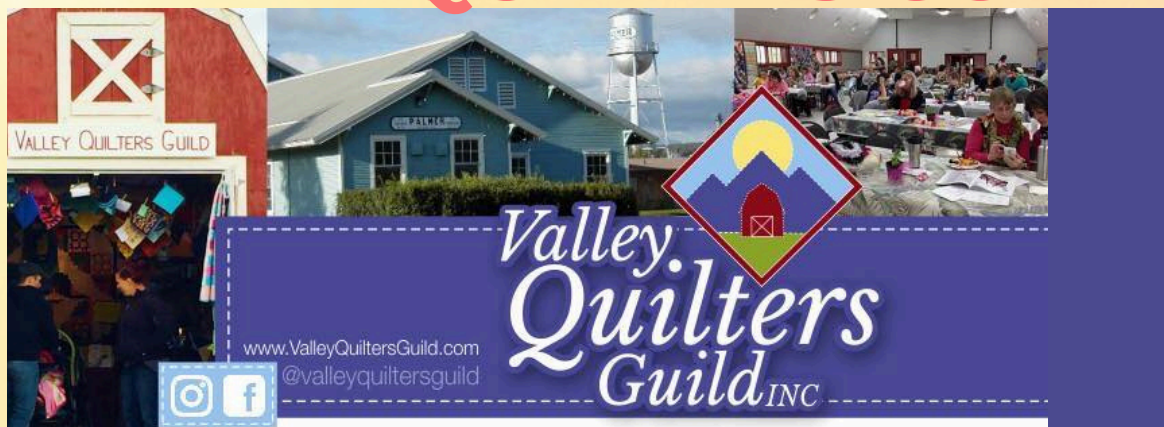

VQG Board Meeting – May 14, 2026

6:37 pm, meeting was not called to order since we didn't have a quorum and no secretary to start.

Attendance: Raye Krueger, Jana Berna, Kim Barr, Christina Traeger, Alex Pine; Paddy Coan joined later.

Also in attendance: Susan Franznick.

- We need committee chairs. Susan Franznick volunteered to Special Santa toy drive to go along with the quilts they collect; will collect in November instead of December.
- VQG will not be represented at Colony Days. The Special Events committee has no chair person. We need to encourage members to join the special events committee.
- Susan Franznick brought up the Walmart Plus program. Michelle Buehner has been allowing Susan/the guild to use her account for ordering batting. It's \$99 per year, and has free shipping on most items. Items can be shipped to different addresses as needed. Jana Berna made a motion to purchase a Walmart Plus account for the guild. Kim Barr seconded the motion. Christina, Paddy, and Alex voted in favor.
- Adding Sundays to calendar for Open Sew Raye reported that about 13 people attended open sew on Sunday. Good turn out for the first time we had open sew on Sunday, and two members were able to come on Sunday that could not come on Saturday. Would like to discuss adding more Sundays to the calendar in the future. We get a discounted rate from the City, and currently have a 2-day open sew scheduled in September. Jana suggested looking at open Sundays for 2027. The Board agreed to book Sundays in 2027 depending on availability. Raye paid out of pocket for the two Sundays we scheduled in 2026 (May and September). Kim Barr made a motion to reimburse Raye the cost of the May and September rental fee. Alex Pine seconded; Christina, Jana, Paddy voted in favor.
- Guild brochures: Confirmed with Sharon Berna/Alaska State Fair Superintendent that we can put guild brochures out at the quilt display at the fair. We need to redesign and update the brochures. We will not include stores on the brochures unless they pay a fee to be included. Raye inquired if anyone knew a graphic designer that could give us an estimate for a new design, and printing. Kim Barr's daughter is a graphic designer, she will get an estimate for 500-1000 brochures and will report back by the June Board meeting.
- Airing of the Quilts – Susan explained it will be a non-vendor quilt display for the community. It will be June 7 from 11-2 pm, they have reserved the Palmer train depot and the pavilion in downtown near where Friday Fling is held. They are asking the owners of the quilts to stay at the event to share any known info about the quilt, and its history. The Guild can set up a table at the depo for new members to sign up.

Program:

Cindy Medberry, owner of Luna's Quilt Shop. Has spent her quilting career doing the opposite of what you're supposed to! The shop reflects what she likes now with bright colors. She personally enjoys classic piecing and English paper piecing (EPP). She does some classes, but not in the summer. She carries pearl cotton for embroidery, less common in most quilt shops.

Tips and Tricks:

- Know your cuts: bias, cross grain, with the grain.
- Don't switch rulers and mats mid project!
- Don't switch your machines either!
- Borders: Don't just cut a strip and pin! Fold into quarters and measure from middle of quilt.
- Fair quilts: Binding full to the edge: cut your backing and batting just a little wider so you can fill in your binding!

 - i. Raye: back page of trifold doc could be ads from quilt shops. Alex still willing to contact quilt shops.
 - ii. Kim: If you put all businesses on back, we're stuck with them. In cases of out of business or falling out. FYI: Daughter thought current front was cute.
 - iii. Marcia: concurs with keeping businesses off. We usually go through about 300 brochures at fair. Count to be ordered dependent on prices.
 - iv. QR code to membership should be included.
 - v. Raye's Summary: Content looks ok. Just need to bring into this century. Replace the businesses page with "more quilting fun" items folks may find on the website.
 - vi. Susan agrees with listing the ways people can get involved with the guild, where DMV doesn't really have a strong participatory draw. Service was in a different place – in charitable section.
 - vii. Susan: what about just printing a bunch of the temp ones Jana printed? Or can it be used as a base for the new? Kim: It can be. Depends on what we want.
 - viii. Marcia: It'd be nice if description was expanded to better cover our goals and missions. Also, mention open sew.
 - ix. Kim: ultimately if you combined the 2, you'd probably get what you want.
 - x. Jana: Please do not use her brochure. That was not the intention of the development.
 - xi. Christina and others: just trust the Graphic designer.
 - xii. A special board meeting or call for bid review upcoming to make decision.
7. Vice President: Kim has chosen to step down Effective Dec 15. We as the board need to pick and nominate a new VP candidate.

Old Business:

1. Open Sews on Sundays: looking to adding more next year. See update in new business.

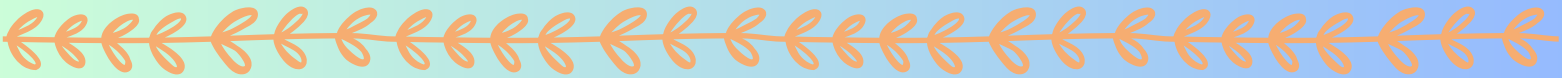
The fair runs from August 21 to September 7, 11am to 10pm, closed Tuesday and Wednesday. The theme is "Celebrating 90 Years With You".
